Notes on Today's Music

from MITCHELL CRAWFORD

Today, the Festival Choir presents music of American composer David Hurd (b. 1950), one of the most significant living composers of American church music. For 28 years, he was Professor of Sacred Music and Director of Chapel Music at General Theological Seminary in Manhattan. He currently serves as Director of Music for The Church of Saint Mary the Virgin in Times Square. *Tell Out, My Soul*, his paraphrase of the *Magnificat*, captures the essence of the composer's style and harmonic language, which is influenced by the 20th century Anglican school (and especially Herbert Howells). The austere setting of the Advent Prose, *Rorate caeli* — found in Isaiah 45:8 — is of a different sort entirely, eschewing the opulence of *Tell Out, My Soul* for the spartan texture characteristic of plainsong. Hurd sets the verses antiphonally; the accompanying bells preface the *unison* refrain.

Calvin Hampton's solo setting of the *Magnificat* is taken from his *Christmas Oratorio*, an early work. While the *Oratorio* itself has not survived in complete form, the *Magnificat* was excerpted and edited for publication by Harry Huff in 2005.

Joining us today are the Old South Ringers, who present their Christmas concert this afternoon at 4pm. In their *Change Ring Prelude*, elements of plainsong are fused together with the technique of change ringing: playing the same notes in an ever-changing specific order.

CLERGY STOLES

Perhaps you have noticed in this 350th Anniversary Year that our clergy have been wearing matching stoles. The stoles were purchased from Stitching Hope, a women's fabric art and sewing cooperative in Chacraseca, Nicaragua. In 2011, a group of creative women, in partnership with JustHope and the founding partner, Federated Church (UCC), Chagrin Falls, Ohio, developed the enterprise. Along with creating jobs and enabling women to work toward their own goals and dreams, Stitching Hope provides training for the women, equipping them with business and financial tools to market their products and run their business. These aspiring women are contributing to their meager family incomes, and are hopeful that the work of their hands will contribute color, texture, and creative energy to the world. Our stoles have been paid for from the Peter Southwell-Sander Fund, named for the Senior Minister's husband, who died in 2006.
