- **Pilgrimage highlights include:** visits to the Equal Justice Initiative Legacy Museum and the National Memorial for Peace and Justice (including memorials to 4400 African American victims of lynching); the newly-constructed Mothers of Gynecology Monument; the Morris Brown Chapel and the By the River Center for Humanity; walking the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma; daily reflection time with Pilgrimage facilitators.
- **Goals include:** learning the history of white racial violence from Reconstruction to Jim Crow; acknowledging the living legacy of white supremacy in our country and the strength of the African American community in resistance as the struggle for freedom continues; creating a learning community among participants to consider continuing work on anti-racist activities
